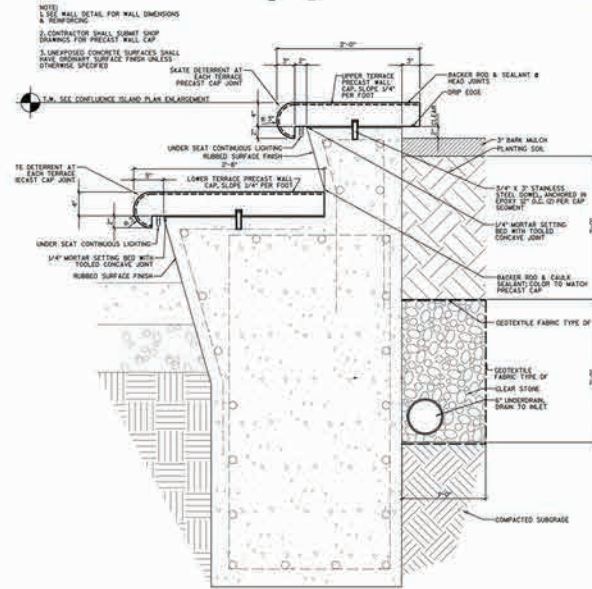
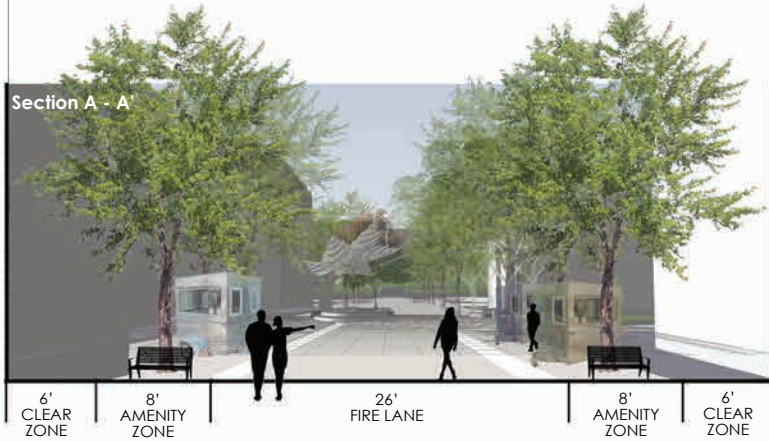

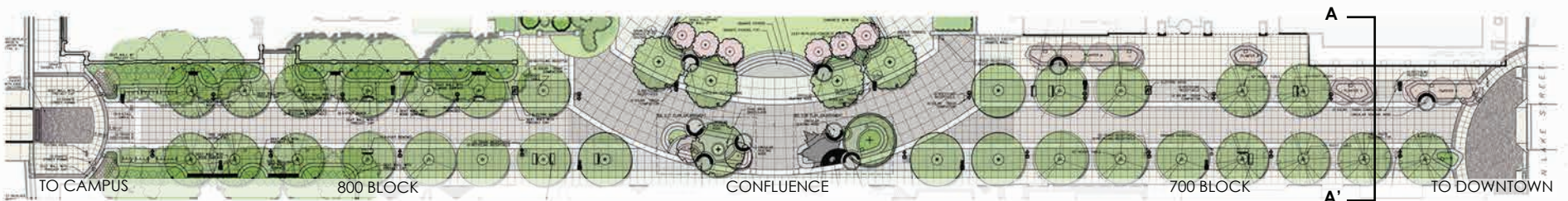

State Street is symbolic of Madison's downtown district, connecting the UW campus to the state capitol building. The project is a redesign of the 700 and 800 block, a pedestrian mall that is a confluence of many iconic features of Madison. The proposed design highlights views to the Capitol, Lake Mendota and Bascom Hill, and creates a series of gathering spaces. The forms of the design lies on a spectrum of informality to formality reflecting the surrounding architecture and representing the image of urban streetscape and academic structure respectively.

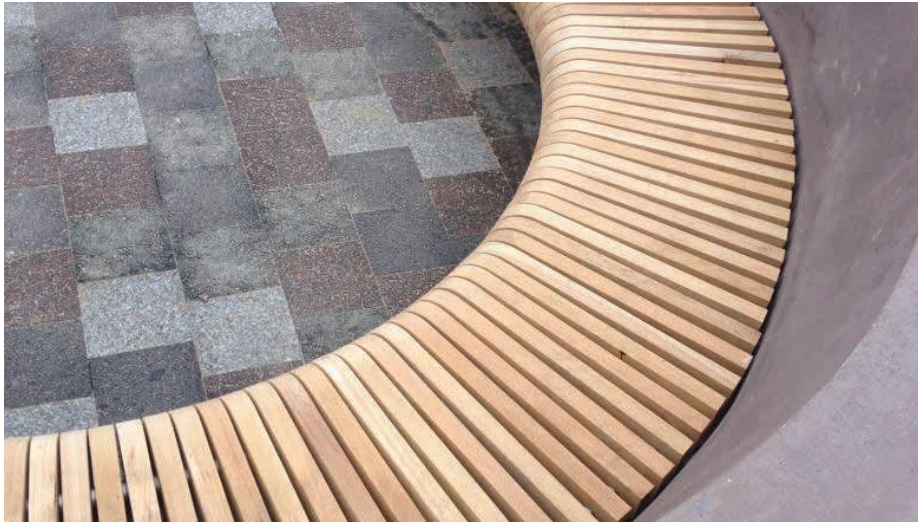
